SUBJECT: Thursday Update

The following information is provided to you as a summary of activities for the week of January 1, 2018 and as an announcement of activities in the coming weeks:

1. As a reminder, the Government Affairs and Public Works Committees will meet on Monday, January 8 at 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m., respectively. The Parks and Recreation Committee has cancelled its meeting for the month of January.
2. As a result of the City's participation in the BWC's Safety Council program this past year, the City will receive a \$2,784 discount off of its annual BWC payroll premium. Thank you to John Crowell, Gary Heitkamp, Julie Prickett, Ben Shapiro, Greg VondenBenken, Terry Willenbrink and Paul Wright for taking turns representing the City at the monthly Greater Cincinnati Safety Council meetings.
3. On December 29, the interview team consisting of Paul Wright, Ben Shapiro, Julee Nies, Julie Machon and Julie Prickett interviewed three candidates (who are current part-time employees with our Fire Department) for a full-time firefighter/paramedic position. Soon there will be a vacant position as Jordan Hall is resigning effective January 13 to take a position with another local fire department. Best wishes to Jordan and his family!
4. On Wednesday, the interview team consisting of Katie Smiddy, Cindy Abner, Paul Wright and Julie Prickett conducted a second round of interviews with four candidates for the tax commissioner position. The interview team utilized results from online personality assessments which provided recommended questions specific to each candidate. The next step in the process is to conduct background checks and extend an offer of employment to the selected candidate.
5. All holiday decorations (greenery, wreaths, bows, etc.) have been removed, cleaned, organized and stored away until next year. On Thursday, January 4, a total of twenty-one volunteers from the community, the Montgomery Women's Club and the Beautification and Tree Commission, along with the public works staff worked together to accomplish this daunting task. Thanks to all our volunteers and staff for their efforts on this annual beautification effort for the holiday season.
6. As a reminder, a retirement reception for Jesse Bundy is being planned for the afternoon of January 26 so save the date! More details to follow.

SUBJECT: December Council Report



Incident Highlights

12/1- Officers responded for a missing 19-year-old developmentally disabled male on Monte Drive. Officers located the missing male at Children's Hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio.

12/4 -Officers responded to Mayfair of Montgomery for a check on the well-being of a resident. Officers made entry into the apartment and located a deceased 67-year-old female. Officers contacted the Hamilton County Coroner's Office who took over the investigation and custody of the body.

12/5- Officer Bierer responded to IR 275 for a single vehicle auto accident. The 25-year-old male driver accelerated and crashed his vehicle on purpose and stated that he wanted to end his life. Officer Bierer arrested the male for operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol and then signed the male into adult psychiatric services at UC Hospital for evaluation. The male tested a .223 BAC.

12/9- Officer Bierer and Officer Riley were dispatched to Marketplace Lane near Go Bananas Comedy Club for an assault occurring in a vehicle. Officer Bierer located a male who had elbowed his wife in the head and pulled out her hair. Officers located hair in the backseat of the vehicle. Both parties were intoxicated and the male was arrested for Domestic Violence and taken to jail.

12/10- Officer Janszen located a wreck on the ramp from northbound 71 to eastbound 275. The driver went off the road and struck a tree. Officer Janszen arrested the very intoxicated female driver for OVI. She subsequently tested a .220 BAC.

12/11- Det. Frazier responded to Gate of Heaven Cemetery to see two female victims regarding their purses being stolen. Both parties were at the cemetery visiting the graves of loved ones when their purses were stolen. Det. Frazier has developed several leads and a suspect and charges should be filed in the upcoming weeks.

12/13 & 12/14- Officers responded to the same address on Arcturus Drive for a 17-year-old male assaulting his parents. On both nights, officers arrested the juvenile and transported him to juvenile detention for Domestic Violence for assaulting his mother and father.

12/15- Officer Otte responded to an address on Laurelview Drive for a 14-year-old male having a psychiatric emergency. The male took out a screen window on the 2nd floor and was threatening to jump and hurt himself. Officer Otte and members of our life squad transported the juvenile to Children's Hospital for a psychiatric evaluation.

12/21- Officer Bertz responded to the Tri-Health Pavilion to see three victims regarding their vehicles being broken into. Each vehicle had a window smashed out and valuables taken. Detectives are attempting to follow up on leads.

12/25- Officer Day and Detective Hoy were dispatched to an address on Grandstone Lane for an unconscious female. After further investigation, the female had been pushed down by her husband, causing her to strike her head on the bathroom floor. Officers arrested the male and transported him to the Hamilton County Justice Center.



Montgomery hiring city manager

MONTGOMERY – The city of Montgomery has several significant items planned for 2018. These include selection of a new city manager and a potential operating levy.

With the resignation of former City Manager Wayne Davis in August, city officials began the search for a new city manager. The selection and announcement of a new one is expected in February. Davis accepted a position as city manager in Centerville, Ohio.

Additionally, the city may place an operating levy on the May ballot. This will go toward funding of the Montgomery Fire Department. The existing fire and emergency medical services tax levy for 5.5 mills, approved in 1999, was expected to fund the department through 2009. The city managed to extend this through

2017, officials said.

Anticipating increased service demands as well as a shortage of part-time fire personnel, Montgomery is expected to go before voters with this ballot issue pending City Council approval of a resolution at its Jan. 3 meeting.

Upcoming road projects include making major repairs to the Interstate-71 overpass above Pfeiffer Road.

The city is also continuing work on its "Gateway Redevelopment Area," which will be a mixed-use project featuring office space, a boutique hotel and condominiums. This will be located in the southern part of town at the corner of Montgomery Road and the Ronald Reagan Highway. Work on this is expected to begin by the end of 2018.

An additional mixed-use development featuring retail, office, restaurants and condominiums is also planned on Montgomery Road north of Interstate-275.
