SUBJECT: Thursday Update

The following information is provided to you as a summary of activities for the week of October 2, 2017 and as an announcement of activities in the coming weeks:

1. As a reminder, the Public Works Committee will meet on Wednesday, October 11 at 4:30 p.m. The Parks and Recreation and Government Affairs Committees have cancelled their meetings for the month of October.
2. A bid opening for Waste Collection Services was held on Monday. A total of two bids were received from Rumpke and Republic Services. Staff will be reviewing the bid results with the Public Works Committee on Wednesday, October 11 and anticipate bringing a legislative request to City Council on October 18.
3. The first Live at the Uni concert featuring acclaimed jazz recording artist, composer and arranger Kim Pensyl returned to the Live at the Uni series on Monday night, October 2 at the Universalist Church. The concert was a hit with 123 people attending. The three-part series continues with a concert on Monday October 16, with jazz vocalist Nancy Nolan. The series concludes with a program of Broadway favorites performed by baritone Sola Fadiran on Monday, October 30. Concerts begin at 7:00 p.m. and each concert is full, with 130 people registered. Twin Lakes Senior Living Community sponsored the Live at the Uni series and Montgomery Inn sponsored the reception. Thanks to the Montgomery Arts Commission for their time in creating this top notch musical concert series for our community.
4. At the completion of the 2016-2017 insurance plan year, the City received \$20,828.23 in premium discounts. This is a substantial increase as compared to the previous plan years, in which the City received \$16,782.05 in 2015-2016 and \$7,056.77 in 2014-2015. This is a total of \$44,667.05 in premium discounts awarded to the City since our contract with Humana Insurance began 2 years ago. A goal of the Employee Wellness team is to closely align our Wellness program with Humana's Go365 program. This relationship has been vital in providing resources and incentives to employees, but also to help increase the discounts the City receives. These discounts are received when employees reach Silver Status within the Humana Go365 program. This increase in engagement and participation has been seen not only in the Humana Go365 program, but also within our TriHealth employee wellness program.
5. Officer Steve Hoy attended a conference for the Ohio Narcotics Regional Coordinating Officers (NARCO) in Columbus, Ohio this week. Steve is a district representative for NARCO, which provides training for undercover police officers and a forum for information exchange on the ever-changing field of drug investigations.

6. Department Heads and Mid-Level Managers participated in a full day Communications training conducted by Mark Weaver of Communications Counsel. This vital training will help to prepare Mid-Level Managers in their engagement responsibilities with improving their public speaking skills.
7. Brian Riblet and Connie Gaylor will met with Sonny Wilkins of Simple Recycling to review the implementation of a free curbside textile recycling program to all residents. City Council approved this contract at Wednesday's City Council Business Session.
8. The deadline for MCLA applications closed on September 30 providing the City with a total of 31 applicants. Thanks to all for your efforts in recruitment. Acceptance letters are now being sent. Faith Lynch will produce and share a roster and biographical pages in the next few weeks.
9. A reminder that next Friday, October 13, City staff will be sponsoring the United Way Soup Kitchen to be held in Council Chambers from 11:00-1:30 pm. A \$7.00 lunch donation will be put towards the City's United Way goal.
10. A reminder to sign up to bring a side dish, salad, dessert or drinks, to the Smokin' Irish Barbecue held on Friday, October 20. Terry Donnellon so graciously supplies the ribs and chicken, we need to round it out with plenty of goodies to accompany it. Follow this [link](#) to sign up.

SUBJECT: September Council Report

Incident Highlights

9/1 Officers responded for the report of a male subject trying to pass a fraudulent prescription at CVS Pharmacy. The male left the scene without the narcotics and the investigation is still ongoing.

9/4 Officers responded for a runaway 17-year-old male on Pfeiffer Road. The male ran away but returned home the following morning without incident.

9/5 Officer LaCalameto, Sgt. Plaatje, and Det. Shreve responded to Bethesda North Hospital for a possible overdose in the parking lot. Officers found a female slumped over the steering wheel with an IV attached to a pump in her arm. The female attempted suicide by injecting drugs to euthanize animals. The attempt was unsuccessful and the female was transported for medical and psychiatric evaluation.

9/11 Officer Otte responded to a residence on Cooper Road for a missing adult female with down syndrome. Officer Otte was familiar with this subject and located her on the rear patio of the Village Tavern. The female returned home unharmed.

9/13 Officer Day responded to Bethesda North Hospital for a nurse injured by a patient. During a patient exam, the patient became agitated and broke the nurse's arm. A warrant was put out for the patient's arrest for assault.

9/17 Officers Nimeskern and LaCalameto responded to a domestic dispute on Twinkle Lane. The male half of the dispute was struck in the head and was bleeding. Officers arrested the female half for Domestic Violence and transported her to jail.

9/20 Officer Payne led a drug sweep at the Sycamore High School. Multiple drug dogs and their handlers assisted in the sweep and several students were arrested for various drug offenses. A sweep was also conducted at the Junior High School with no arrests made.

9/26 Officer Martin and Sgt. Harris responded to Bethesda North Hospital for trouble between a boyfriend and girlfriend. The female victim had given birth 6 hours prior to this incident and her boyfriend was upset with her name choice for the child. The boyfriend threw a remote at the female while she was holding the newborn baby. He then stole \$100.00 from her wallet and fled the hospital prior to the arrival of officers. Officers put out warrants for Domestic Violence and Theft. This case is ongoing.

9/29 Officer Janszen located 6 juveniles in Dulle Park after the park was closed. The 6 were found with marijuana, a bottle of rum, and brass knuckles. All 6 were charged and released to their parents.


